CASA CIS as your charity.



Meet the Advocate



Roberto Saldana is one of our newest advocates. Rob fills a lot of gaps in our organization -- we are always seeking more male advocates, and he's Spanish-speaking, as well! His supervisor hand-picked him for a specific, complicated case before he even finished training. On why Rob became a CASA:

To be able to be a part of an organization that is dedicated to helping every abused or neglected child find an opportunity to thrive in a safe and loving home is an honor and a privilege. I can genuinely empathize with kids who deal with such hardship. I grew up in a broken home with no father and a mother who did her best to keep our family together despite dealing with an almost insurmountable amount of stress and adversity. Quite often, I experienced the perils of neglect and abuse from the hands of other family members who lived in the household with us. What I would like to accomplish as a CASA is uncomplicated and straightforward: to be a beacon of hope for a child who is going through such hardship and be that anchor for him or her during such troubling times.

Additionally, I would like to support the parents in any way I can by ensuring that they are meeting all their court-appointed stipulations as required. At the end of the day, the overarching goal I would like to accomplish is that both the parent(s) and child(ren) are in a position where they can be happy in their situation. Given my childhood, one of the things I always strived to do was help underprivileged communities see that there is hope and better days moving forward. I have been able to rise from my troubled upbringing and been fortunate enough to join the Army and attain my Master's in Public Health. What I

would like to do now is to give back and help those in need, and I believe the CASA program is a perfect place to start doing so.

Upcoming Info Sessions and Training

Our upcoming info sessions will be held on March 8, March 22, April 5, April 19, May 3, and May 17. The application deadline for our next training is May 19, 2023.
